

Deborah Bhanojirow gave the Treasurer's report from Debra Anderson who was attending a church function. In December, AI's balance was \$6,416.35. After expenses of \$9.80 and \$260.00 and deposits of \$656.00, the balance stands at \$6,802.55. Minutes taken by Cathy Schreiber at the December meeting were perused. Bonnie Strohm made a motion to accept the minutes as amended with Deborah Bhanojirow seconding. The motion carried.

Under Old Business, Cheryl stated that Maureen Keillor donated two hours of genealogy help for the silent auction in December. By Laws Committee will present their recommendations in May. Cindy Thompson reported on the Reading Bowl at Kendrick Middle. Cheryl's team placed third. Chery also volunteered at the regional reading bowl at Clayton State. The next business concerned working with new teachers at Clayton State. There was discussion regarding teacher training and that few students are going into education. Ferst Foundation Luncheon is also coming up with Bonnie Strohm and her committee in charge of decorating the AI table. Delta Hostel is the next AI project. Cheryl stated that 43 had registered for Friday night and 32 for Saturday. Cheryl also ordered 8 red and 8 white tablecloths from Tablecloth.com for AI. Under New Business, the Leadership Institute was excellent according to those from AI who attended. It was mentioned at this conference that there may be a name change for DKG to Women Educators International. Currently DKG has around 69,000 members. DKG gave three million to education. The Leadership Conference is April 20 and 21 in Warner Robins. This conference asked to donate to its silent auction. Benita Moore will create a basket for AI.

It was noted we need to bring materials for Haven House. Linda Holcomb volunteered to take those items to this shelter. AI is still collecting books for classroom libraries. The Happy Jar went around. Members told of happy events as the donated to this jar whose funds are used for school tuition in Liberia. Officers for the next biennium were announced: Cheryl Goff, President; Deborah Bhanojirow, 1st Vice President; Carol Bentley, 2nd Vice President, Anita Thomaston, Recording Secretary, Martha Tolcher, Corresponding Secretary, Debra Anderson, Treasurer, Bonnie Strohm, Parliamentarian. Cindy Thompson made a motion to accept these officers with Laura Michelle Woods seconding. Motion carried. Cathy Schreiber will install officers in May.

Cindy Thompson report that Randalyn Sandlin Freelander will speak at the victory celebration for the Reading Bowl champions. Cheryl then showed a six minute video regarding DKG and the role of committees.
