

Linda Holcomb can share about the *school in Libya* where she does mission trips. We typically sponsor children for their schooling.

November 6th Meeting



Program: Maureen knows Victoria Wilcox, an expert on Doc Holliday, a native of Griffin, Georgia. Ms. Wilcox has written several books, including one about Doc Holliday. When the antebellum home of Holliday's uncle was scheduled for demolition, she formed a non-profit organization to save the structure and turn it into a museum. The Holliday-Dorsey-Fife Museum in Fayetteville was added to the National Register of Historic Places in 2008. Maureen will arrange for this presentation.

Meal: Cheryl will contact Dawn at Jonesboro United Methodist about catering a festive meal. Reservations will be necessary.

Service Project: Several possibilities were discussed. Kathy Acree will check into the *shoebox project* done by Samaritan's Purse to give us details.
